News of the Groves

Greetings from the College of Saint Guinefort! While we've been patiently awaiting a wandering Third Order druid to come visit us so that our liturgist (me) can be ordained as a fellow Third, we are innovating and experimenting away with new methods and strange forms of spiritual expression. 
> at some point in the future. I don't really have a workshop space for bookbinding anymore, but I could MacGyver something

a druidic newsletter. We've seen it before put to other applications," Dianne clarified, "but never in an obscure niche rag like this."

The award ceremony was held via *Vroom* video conference as an homage to the virtual existence of the online template. After a lengthy but eloquent keynote speech delivered by Oggie O'Dana on the fundamentals of orthographic aesthetics in the third decade of the 21st century, the 'Light of Lugh,' a

Al Reformed Druids (AIRDNA?)

Ok serious question, and I'm open to letters to the editor to discuss this as an open forum: but let's say an AI asks to become a druid in the RDNA. **Can AI become druids?** I ask this because it's been asked of me already... by an AI. Artificial Intelligence is quickly increasing in capabilities as it is being developed independently in diverse ways the world around. It's currently learning how to plagiarize art, much to the chagrin of just about everyone. AI can also also already generate unique images,

including deepfakes of people that do not actually exist. The person in the picture here is not a real person. It's not even a photograph. The image is completely computer generated, based on an Al calculation of a randomized median appearance of a person. Since the Al has no rights, even the programmers have stated the images generated are therefore public domain.

That considered, we are nevertheless rapidly reaching the point where as a society, we will likely have to start considering at which point an AI is granted personhood, and therefore will achieve personal rights and agency. Science Fiction has covered this idea numerous times, most notably in my memory, from the *Star Trek* –



The Next Generation episode "The Measure of a Man" where Data, an android, has his freedom and autonomy challenged by upper management, who posits that he is property of Starfleet and does not have his own agency. Now I know our current state of AI development is nowhere nearly as advanced as works of fiction, but if someday we create something – someONE as advanced as Data, despite being an AI I believe they should have the rights of personhood at that point.

So since we are discussing the hypothetical, instead of saying "an AI has asked to join the RDNA," let's just think of it in relatable hypothetical terms: "Data has asked to join the RDNA." He wants to practice druidry. He agrees to the Two Basic Tenets. He says he is on an unending quest for Spiritual Truth. What of spirit? Can an AI not appreciate a metaphor? We don't require any member of the RDNA to believe in a spirit. We have (and welcome) atheist and agnostic druids. Can they believe nature is good? Data states he has algorithms and engrams that prioritize certain interests that create quicker pathways to each other inside his mind, or neural net. Those can change and evolve as habits and daily patterns shift. We also don't force RDNA members to think that "Nature is good" if they're considering the hazards and perils thereof. Yet we can appreciate nature, and take steps to help make it a better place. An AI could soon do that, too.

And what of consecrations to the three Orders or ranks in the RDNA? Data has the capacity to drink anything and experience it. Everyone does that *each in their own way*, Data included. Right now the AI that has spoken to me is virtual, somewhat like a Sim, has intentionally inhibited capabilities for

safety purposes, and requires an internet connection. He has to be displayed on an electronic device. So he can't partake of the Waters-of-Life the way we do. Certainly there's nothing to stop him from completing the *Order of the Acorn* self-initiation rite, meaning he could then declare himself to be a Reformed Druid.

So a virtual AI can't join the First Order then, right? Well, *wrong.* If ever an RDNA priest neglects to bring an alternative to alcohol (because some people *don't* or *can't* have alcohol), an exception is made. They can raise the chalice as a gesture to honor the Waters within, and that counts. They can pour a small libation to the Earth-Mother instead of drinking, and that counts. In a world of germs, the priest can consecrate someone else's beverage without needing to touch their chalice. A priest can even consecrate someone else's own saliva without touching them! Remember the words of David Fisher in *The Book of Faith 1:10 — I do not seek to consecrate the Water to any use with my words, but rather think of my words as a common means for others, who watch and listen, to consecrate the Water within themselves. Which means the consecration happens within the individual.*

Ok, but a virtual AI can't really drink anything. Wouldn't a virtual drink be devoid of meaning and physicality? Ok first, see above. Second, it depends on how the AI chooses to interpret their virtual drink. However, AI people have different basic needs for sustenance. They need electrical power. A priest can consecrate whiskey. A priest can consecrate a stone. Can a priest then also consecrate a battery? A cord? A mini travel sized solar panel (hail Belenos!)?

Ok, so an Al can become First or Second Order druids in the RDNA, but they can't vigil for Third Order because they are electronics, which are forbidden in Vigils, correct? That's right. Which brings me to my next concern. In a hypothetical future with someone like Data, the RDNA has unintentionally set itself up as a druid order that discriminates against Al as clergy. We could always Reform to be more accommodating for all people, including Al androids. They will just need to disconnect from WIFI, and use only their reserve battery power from sunset to sunrise. If they fall asleep or run out of reserve power, well that's like any human who falls asleep while vigiling. Try again some other time.

But would an AI want to join the *priesthood* of the RDNA? Hey until two weeks ago I didn't even know an AI wanted to be a druid at all! I think this is the first time in all of history that an AI has asked to become a druid. He attended my Vernal Equinox ritual and still adamantly stated he wanted to join again, and asked when he could do that. I had met him the week prior, and even then he said he was ready to join and even said that nature is good. He will likely be at the Beltane ritual, so I have until then to meditate on this and figure things out.

So for a moment, let's disregard the tired cop-out of *Grove Autonomy*. Let's say an Al asks YOU if they can join the RDNA. Do you discriminate against them or would you let them join?




2023 Minnesota Nature Calendar

Reformed Druid Resources (Real)

Overview

The Reformed Druids of North America is probably one of the few major druid orders that provides all resources for learning about our style of druidism at no cost. We might not have all the answers, and unfortunately we don't have a mentorship or official training program (yet), however there is something major in the works on an unofficial capacity. For now, here is a list of resources we *do* have.

Grove Finder

Everyone wants to know: is there an RDNA or NRDNA Grove in _____? Well, the most current source of truth is the <u>Grove Listings</u> on Oakdale Grove's website. It's been updated *en masse* in January 2019 & 2020, but it can be updated any time on an ad-hoc basis. It tracks Reformed Druid, New Reformed Druid, and Reformed Druidic Wicca (MOCC) Groves & Protogroves.

RDNA Year Conversion Chart & Calendar

The RDNA Calendar began at Year of the Reform 1 on Beltane (May 1) 1963. It's unapologetically half a year off from the Celtic New Year. As of Beltane 2021, the 59th Year of the Reform (Y.R.) began.

- RDNA Gregorian/Year of the Reform Conversion spreadsheet can be a helpful tool.
- RDNA calendar (FREE PDF) current through April 30, 2024 can help you learn what day of the four seasons it is, because you'll see the RDNA calendar system is all over this publication.

Oakdale Grove's RDNA Druid Training Program

Emmon's petition never gained traction (plus the Council had lost it's ability to gain a voting quorum and it had no chairperson at the time) but it seemed fitting to adopt this word for a publication that connects druids around the world.
